Town updates

Northfield Campus. The vistas from the Northfield Campus and Roundtop are constant reminders for the beauty of this place. There is still no news about a new occupant for the campus, but the National Christian Foundation is actively seeking options and we appreciate their dedicated stewardship of this property that is such an important past legacy and future vision for our community.

As you turn onto Main Street you may see some familiar scenes and a few new changes. Look for your neighbors on Mim's porch and get in line at the Creamie. Then you may notice the transitions in town. **Fairview Gardens** has closed as the owners have moved on to other opportunities. **Northfield Coffee and Books** is also closing and a new business is being planned for that space.

The **Trinitarian Church** looks the same but it has changes inside as it welcomes Rev Julie Olmstead, the new settled pastor.

The **Town** has a strong **environmental focus** as plans are made for open space, conservation, wetlands protection, and the Schell Bridge. You will notice "Stop the Pipeline" signs in town. These reflect the active debate and protest about the Kinder Morgan gas pipeline that is proposed for western MA and southern NH. Northfield Mt Hermon Forest and the Grandin Reservoir. The Trust for Public Land continues to facilitate conservation efforts for this 1600-acre forest adjacent to the Ridge. The state of Massachusetts has expressed interest in holding the conservation easement for the land, and (great news!), there is a potential buyer for the East Northfield Water Co. As you can imagine the deal is complex and it has been difficult to complete surveys on the multiple land parcels deeded from the 1800's, but even with these delays, we see progress!
