The Sanitary Committee was asked to look into the matter of Sanitary collections so as to secure an additional collection in June and also in September.

The posting of the Reward notice was authorized.

Mr. Hocher was reappointed Agent of the Ridge and the Treasurer was authorized to give him \$20.00 as an expression of appreciation for his services in securing the installation of electric light.

The Thanks of the Association was extended to Mr. A. S. Moody and his office clerk for sending out the notices and the bill was ordered paid.

The Association extended their hearty thanks to Dr. Peacock and his household for their generous hospitality.

The Ridge Agent was requested to ask Northfield town to provide lights on North Lane. The Executive Committee

was authorized to have the willows ~~be~~ ^{be} ~~practiced~~ also to have a path constructed through the willows

The Chairman of the Milk Committee was ~~not~~ asked to investigate the sterilization of milk bottles.

The following action was taken — Whereas: at the last annual meeting of the Rustic Ridge Association it was voted that a system of electric light be installed, that one half of the secondary lines be borne by the Association and one half by the users of these lines, and

whereas there has been an unequal distribution of expense in connection with the secondary lines,

Therefore Be it resolved that all users of electricity shall pay into the treasury of the Association \$10.00 as per agreement by each subscriber and that those whose bills has exceeded ten dollars shall be reimbursed to any amount of the excess of \$10.00 from the funds of the treasury of the Association, when the amount of in the treasury warrants such reimbursement.

And be it further resolved that each additional subscriber shall pay into the treasury ten dollars, the same to be used for the general welfare of the Ridge.

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All subscribers whose expense has exceeded \$10⁰⁰ shall present to the Treasurer of the Association the original bill of expense for connecting with the secondary lines.
