The annual meeting of the Rustic Ridge Association was held at the Cottage of Rev. Wesley Desjardins upon the invitation of Mr. & Mrs. Desjardins. D. J. L. Peacock President of the Association presided and the meeting was opened with prayer by the Rev. C. E. Woodruff. The minutes of his last annual meeting were read and approved. The minutes of the meeting of the Executive Committee of Aug. 17, 1928 and Aug. 10, 1929 were read. The following recommendations were adopted.

a. That the tax rate for 1929 - 1930 be  $\frac{3}{4}$  of 1% of the town assessment of 1922.

b. That owners and agents are urged to bear in mind that property be <sup>only</sup> sold or rented to those who are in harmony with Northfield ideals and will live up to the Rules & Regulations of the Association.

The Executive Committee was authorized to have the Rules & Regulations brought up to date and printed in two forms one for correspondence & the other on cards to be placed in cottages.

The Treasurer's Report was read and adopted.

While the nominating Committee was in session those present were introduced. a letter was read from Mr. Philip T. Phelps.

In the absence of members of the Condolence Committee Mrs. Lent read Mr. Phelps report for the Condolence Committee and the sympathy of the Association was extended to the relatives of Mr. George A. Andrews, Mr. Charles Allen Jones and Mrs. E. O. Taylor. and the report of the Committee was adopted & ordered filed.

Mr. Anderson read the report of Mr. Phelps report for the Mills and Salvage Committee. There was no report from the Ice-Drinking Committee. Mr. A. S. Moody reported for the Road Committee and the announcement was made that the town had appropriated \$300 for the blasting of the rock on North Lane opposite Dr. Zimney's Cottage. Complaint was made of the condition of Mountain Road and the drilled rock on the way to the Willows.

The posting of the Reward notice was authorized.

The thanks of the Association was extended to Mr. A. S. Moody <sup>and</sup> and his office clerk <sup>Mr. Coleman</sup> for service rendered the night.

insurance and on the complaint of three persons that a dog is a nuisance the Executive Committee is instructed to bring the matter to the attention of the Town authorities.

It was moved that Dr. Perceck the retiring President be a member of the Executive Committee.

It was made a Rule of the Association that the retiring President be a member of the Executive Comm. for the following year.

The minutes of the Annual Meeting were read and approved.

It was stated that all the bills for the wiring of the lanes have been paid, except for charges recently made.

Letter heads were ordered.

Mr. Moody agreed that his secretary would send notices of Committee appointments to each chairman of Committee.

The amending and re-printing of the Rules & Regulations was left to the President and Secretary with power to act.

A special committee consisting of D. Peacock & M. Robinson was appointed with power to act - 5 place poles in one lane also to establish the line permanently in this lane, this to be done with care come a year till all have been covered.

The President was authorized to present to Mr. Montoya chairman of the town elections, a request for the oiling of North Lane.

The Road Committee was authorized to provide and place signs on the Ridge.

Dr. Peacock reported that he had engaged Mr. Morse to collect the garbage next year at the same rate, twenty collections at the rate of six dollars a collection; also that the same arrangement as this year had been made for milk in 1930
