Mr. Aylsworth was authorized to have the hairpin curve on North Lane cleaned out; also to see if the couplings are available for fire stand pipes and in view of new arrangements have the fire alarms taken down.

We also recommend that the Ridge Association take action asking the Board of Selectmen to repair and oil North Lane.

ANNUAL MEETING
RUSTIC RIDGE ASSOCIATION
August 25, 1932

The Annual Meeting of the Rustic Ridge Association was held at the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Anderson, West Lane, Tuesday, August 23, 1932, at 3 o'clock.

The President was in the chair.

In the absence of the Secretary, Rev. James M. Lent was asked to serve as Secretary pro tem.

Prayer was offered by Rev. W. W. Coe.

There were no minutes of the last meeting.

Report of the Treasurer was given by the President in the absence of Miss Kinsman. The Report was accepted.

Milk and Garbage Reported by Mrs. Jenkins to be quite satisfactory with emphasis placed upon the need of placing cans by the roadside on collection days.

The cost of collection for the coming year is to remain the same as last year.

Road Committee Mr. Anderson, Chairman, reported much work done, but not complete satisfaction. The report was accepted and referred back to Mr. Anderson, at his request, that there might be further investigation of the bill for road work, which amounted to \$203.65.

Auditing Committee. Report by Mrs. Anderson accepted.

Condolence Committee Mr. Francis Jones reported letters sent to Doctor Aylesworth, Miss Pedley and Miss Simar. Accepted.

Hospitality Committee Mr. Phelps, Chairman, reported as to place of meeting, also suggested a letter of greeting to Mrs. Arthur Romig of China.

The Chairman called upon Mr. Coe for remarks. He suggested improvements in some of the cottages to be rented, and also noted that too high rental prices had resulted in some unoccupied houses.
