North Lane.

The Annual Meeting of the Rustic Ridge Association was held at Kiora Lodge the home of Mrs Charles D. cigar.

Dr. C. C. Woodruff, President of the Association presided and the meeting was opened with prayer by the Rev. Dr. Bobbman.

The minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved.

The President appointed the following nominating Committee,

the Rev. Mr. der Jardine, Chairman, Mrs Jenkins and Mr. Francis Jones.

The Treasurer's report was accepted and placed on file.

Mrs Jenkins reported for the Garbage and Milk Committee.

Cottagers were asked to have garbage cans in good condition and before and after the appointed date of collection garbage is to be cared for by private arrangement.

Collections begin with June 1 and there is one collection after Labor day.

Mrs Anderson reported for the Roads Committee.

Two culverts had been placed, a real road built on Westway and cinders placed at 20 locations.

The chairman stated proposed repairs including the south and north ends of East Lane.

The ~~Treasurer~~ Committee were to inquire if there is an outstanding road bill.

The matter of making West Lane a one way road was referred to
the Road Committee with power to act.

The Auditing Committee reported books audited and found correct.

Dr. Peacock read a memorial on the death of Mrs. Swope and
announced that he had just learned of the death of Mrs. Conlee
and that a memorial for her would be prepared and sent to Dr. Conlee.

Mr. Phelps reported for the condolence committee and announced
that Mrs. Johnson invited the Association to hold their next Annual
Meeting at her cottage.

The Executive Committee report was read and received
and the following action on their recommendations was taken:

1st That the Tax Rate be the same as last year.

2nd That Dr. Coe be appointed Ridge Agent for another year.

The President was authorized to write to Miss Kinsman.

The garage bill for \$26.⁰⁰ was offered and referred to the Treasurer
for payment. The recommendation of the Garage Committee that
Mr. Morse be engaged for another year for not more than \$26.⁰⁰ and the
same number of collections.

The President reports our tax situation in a little better shape.

The present Bank balance being 219.54 and 54.71 in cash ready for deposit.

The President was authorized to write a letter promising tax collection,

The President and Mr. Col or Mr. Worthy were appointed a committee to see

commended.

The President was authorized to sign checks until such time as
a treasurer is secured.

The Garage bill for 126.00 was to be paid and \$100.00 on the Road bill
