The minutes of Aug. 16, 1934 & May 1, 1934 were read.

The treasurer gave his report of condition up to date and estimated after all expenditures a balance of fifty dollars at the close of his year.

Conditions on the upper Ridge were to be remedied, the brush at the hair pin curve was to be cut. A sign "Slow" placed at the curve west of Dr. Toncup's cottage. and Mr. Anderson was authorized to place a map at the bulletin Board ^{south} ~~east~~ of West Lane and a device for registration the Ridge auto. to pay the expense.

The Executive Comm - ^{maneuverably} recommends for adoption by the Annual Meeting the following resolution

"It is the sense of this Annual Meeting of the Rustic Ridge Association that the Ridge roads should become public ways and we therefore authorize the Executive Committee to take the necessary steps therefore."

It was recommended that the Ridge Tax be the same as last year.

The Rev Mr. Phelps & the Secretary were appointed a Committee to see what could be done, and found that the best that could be done was to take orders at the Annual Meeting for cash - directories to be sent to the given address.

It was suggested that the name of Ridge and the number of Ridge be given and the statement made that all roads are marked.

The Answer to a question from Mr. Cheshburgh was left in the hands of the President & the Treasurer.

It was recommended that the Tax Rate be the same as last year - 1% of the 1929 Town Assessment, and no one to pay less than three dollars.

It was recommended that the Rev. Mr. Cole be appointed the Ridge Agent.

to recommend a communication to sent to the select men asking
them to ~~go~~ continue the surveying on North Lane
and to give further careful consideration to the matter of
taking over the Ridge Road.

It was recommended that the thanks of the Association
be given to the Police Patrol.

The Executive Committee learned with regret of the death of
the Rev. Mr. Wright and authorized the President to send a right
letter from the Executive Committee to Mrs. Wright.

The Committee adjourned with the benediction by the President.
