Rev. A.L.Berger led in a memorial prayer for the departed.

The President reported that on a trip to the Ridge is in May he had found the roads in very bad condition & had taken steps to have them repaired immediately. He expressed it as his opinion that the future of the Ridge is bright, as the attendance at the conferences this summer has been larger than before & the General Conference was self-supporting.

Mr. Thomas J. Duncan, chairman of the Road Committee, paid tribute to Dr Woodruff in coming to Northfield in the Spring to take care of the roads. Report accepted with
